The Federal Office of Public Health (FOPH) is committed to promoting equal opportunities for all people in Swiss healthcare. Ensuring that the most vulnerable people have access to the healthcare system at the right time, and providing high-quality, patient-centred care, are key issues in achieving equity in healthcare.

The aim of this conference is to encourage the sharing of experience and the transfer of knowledge and good practice on the subject of equity in healthcare in Switzerland. The aim is to identify levers, tools and measures for taking concrete action to promote equity in healthcare in Switzerland.

The programme will begin with a spotlight at the current issues and challenges of equity in healthcare in other European countries (Block I). The presentation of the Swiss Health Network for Equity (SH4E) will then illustrate a new dynamic in Switzerland in favour of equity in healthcare (Block II). The focus will then be on the contributions of research and the possible impact of new data on professional practices, healthcare organisations and the quality of care (Block III). Finally, the theme of equity, mental health and forced migration will be developed (block IV).

The Forum is aimed at health and social care professionals, authorities such as federal and cantonal health and social care departments, researchers and patient associations working in the field of care for migrant and vulnerable populations, patients' rights and quality of care.

The conference is organised in hybrid mode (on site and virtual) and will be simultaneously translated into French, German and English.
